

Summary of 2009 Season

1st XI: An up and down season for "the Trees" starting off against Harrow and winning chasing 275, moral was high even though we did our best to try and throw it away. The highlight of this match was our newest addition Anant Brahmbhatt, "AB" who showed that you do not score in singles. We reached the finish line with 2 wickets to spare.

The next couple of weeks saw close games again, losing with one over to spare to Southgate and by 3 runs to Enfield. The Trees brought back down to earth.

Luck changed for the Trees, 3 wins on the bounce including an impressive victory against a much fancied Twickenham side. Bowling the opposition out for 93 with Matthew Lowen producing a breathtaking spell of swing bowling taking 4 wickets; we did cross the finishing line in nervous circumstances by 4 wickets.

Comfortable victories over North London and Uxbridge sent us up to second. To add, Naz Ali bowled well taking 5 for 54 in the latter.

During the first 5 League games the team was very inconsistent and relied heavily on the batting partnerships of Luke Budden and AB. As well also as Naz and Matthew with the opening bowling partnerships. I must also add that there were a few cameos of batting from a Mr Mughal.

However our fortunes seemed to decline over the rest of the season as the weather and the lack of experience going against the Trees. With no results in 2 games and losses in the other 3, times became a little bit nervous. Losing the flips of the coin and poor batting displays, notably against South Hampstead and Acton, did not help the cause.

A change of fortunes over the next couple of weeks collecting winning draws against Enfield and North London, in games that the Trees should have won. A change in these fortunes has to be linked to the 2 newest additions to the club, the 2 Pauls (Atherley and Sylvester). These games were very frustrating especially at Enfield where they collapsed to 58 for 7 with over 30 overs to take the final few wickets, but the Trees became unstuck and had to settle for the 4 points.

As the season concluded, teams around Brentham were picking up points and so the gap at the bottom was getting smaller. The next 4 games started off against Twickenham, who seeking their revenge bowled the Trees out for 76. The next game brought our first centurion of the season (Enter Parag our overseas player who arrived slightly late scoring 135), but the next was a disappointment. The trees were unable to defend a score of 270 in an exciting game where Acton only had two wickets to spare when reaching their target.

With 2 games left the Trees were only 8 points above the bottom 2 but with Uxbridge effectively gone, it was between 4 clubs for the other relegation spot.

The penultimate game saw us lose to North Middlesex after being bowled out for 146, a side with promotion in their eyes and totally dominated the game from start to finish. So the last game against South Hampstead meant destiny was in our own hands, as long as they did not win the Trees would survive. In a nervous game an important toss win meant that Brentham bowled first taking full advantage of the new ball bowling the opposition out for 103. A simple task you might add, not at Brentham. However on this occasion we batted sensibly (for the first time of the season) and won by 6 wickets. A season that started off with so much promise turned into a dogfight.

But lets get our priorities right, a young side with Tom Brandreth showing there is a bright future by showing some gutsy batting at the start of many innings. Matt Lowen by far the best bowling taking 32 wickets at an average of just over 15; impressive reading. He was supported largely by Naz Ali (26 wickets at 29.35) and Sully Mughal with 20 at 23.15. When looking at the batting AB scored 516 runs at an average of 47, not bad for a man who played 5 games in the 2s when Parag arrived. Along came Mr Budden with 436 at 29.07. Paul Atherley, Amit Puri and Parag Khanapurkar all contributing with over 200 runs in the year.

Thanks must go to Ivor; his dedication and hard work has helped me during my first year of captaincy. Hopefully last year can be used as a stepping stone to progress this season. With more West London clubs being represented in the Premier League, the local area is becoming more competitive and we need to step up to the task. Up the Trees!!!

2nd XI: What a season! Having been looking over our shoulders at one stage at the lower placings, to finish the season with 5 wins from our last 6 games and finish in second place, thus winning promotion at the first attempt back up to the top division was a great achievement. Not only that but 147 turned one (he tells me), Jazz and DT turned up for a match on time and Bolg went through a whole game without contributing any leg byes. Rumours of Pikey buying a round though have yet to be substantiated.

At the end of the 2008 season which saw us relegated from the top division, I thanked the players for all their efforts and expressed the intention to bounce straight back. That we managed to do this with a much changed team made it even more satisfying. Unfortunately the 2nd XI scorebook went missing after the final Kenton game while I was away having my wisdom teeth out, so I'm unable to provide the same level of stats as in previous years. The season started at newly promoted Harrow. A lack of pre-season preparation from our side and a good performance from Harrow saw us having to settle for a point.

The next game saw us claim our first victory of the season, with Alex Watson picking up 5 wickets against Shepherds Bush on a damp wicket. As they struggled to 130, so too did we in the run chase. Chris Healey's 50 was match-winning although 4 byes saw us creep over the line with 8 wickets down.

Our next game saw us to travel to Finchley. On probably the best wicket we played on during the season, some hostile bowling was seen off by a bruised skip who made 95, with some able lower order contributions seeing us over 200. An interesting opening over from Pikey with 11 runs after 1 legitimate ball saw Finchley off to a flyer, but superb spells from Jayesh and 147 reigned in their scoring and only some tail-end blocking saw us fail to gain 10 points – we settled for 4.

Next up were another newly promoted side in Highgate. Once again a good bowling display from Jayesh and 5 catches without the gloves from Skip saw us put pressure on their batters. Chasing 160, James Overy hit a belligerent 80 to see us home despite the traditional Brentham late collapse.

Top of the table Acton were our next opponents. As usual a tricky wicket and some good bowling put us under pressure. PK making his debut and Joe Brandreth late on supported skips unbeaten 107, well with 30s as we made 190. PK shone with the ball, bowling a great spell of leg-breaks and googlies taking 6 wickets and we came so close to taking the last wicket, but had to settle for a point.

The game against Barnes saw us fall to our first defeat. 50 from PK was really the only highlight as they comfortably passed our total. They were to beat us again later in the season when 10 dropped catches contributed to our own downfall.

Uxbridge saw the tradition of Brentham captains losing tosses continued by Pikey against the bottom team. Batting first, PK with 94 and Bolg 46 help us to a total well beyond a struggling Uxbridge team.

Unfortunately despite another 5-for from PK their tail-end were able to block out and another 4 points were ours.

Our trip to Kenton was full of incident. Some excellent hitting from their opener who made 80 before attempting a Gatting-esque suicidal reverse sweep initiated a major collapse to 130. PK and 147 picking up good hauls. In response we made a stuttering start and were 64-4 before 4 leg byes came our way (Bolg wasn't even playing!). A couple of drops started to fall followed by hailstones and a major storm game over and we had got the 4 points by 1 run. Home games against Ickenham and Harrow yielded a point and 4 points (the later thanks to a superb 60 from Bolg in the rain) and we were lying in 7th place.

Shepherds Bush saw the debut of Paul S and Leroy and their contributions of 80 and 42 plus 5 wickets leading to an excellent victory were outstanding. A total of 200 was way beyond the Bush as Leroy's pace and AB & 147s spin/slow bowling respectively saw them out for below 100. A wet wicket and a lost toss wrote off our chances against Finchley, but we were back to winning ways at Highgate, again in the Brentham way, not before a lot of laps from skip & Bolg. Excellent bowling from Leroy, Pikey denied a hat-trick and 147 & AB all contributed to us chasing 114 for victory. Regular wickets fell before Jazz came in and struck a superb 42 to win the game.

Another damp wicket but this time a won toss saw us beat Acton convincingly, with AB hitting 60 chasing down 130 with 147, Pikey & AB contributing well with wickets again.

Following the defeat against Barnes, we bounced back well with a convincing victory against Uxbridge who were relegated as a result. A weakened side against Kenton was lead by Jayesh who put in a captains performance with both bat and ball in inspiring a win which put us within touching distance of promotion in the game against Ickenham. With an excellent bowling performances with 147 and JK again in the wickets, Fraser was able to make hay and score his maiden 2's league 50, ably supported by Tom Brandreth, seeing us home to victory by 9 wickets and promotion
