

Summary of 2004 Season

The1st XI Season began with the first game being rained off against South Hampstead. Brentham had won their opening games of the season in the past 2 years and this year was to be no exception. Their first opponents were Enfield, who were favoured for promotion and with both teams known for playing aggressive cricket, it was no surprise that a result was decided in the last over, with a run out as Enfield pressed for the 5 runs required to steal the four points. As in previous years though Brentham were unable to capitalise on this start and only mustered 2 points from their next 3 games.

Even early in the season there was considerable focus on the newly implemented '17 overs an hour' bowling rate with the threat of point deductions and Brentham missing key slow bowlers. Fortunately for the team, results had been going in their favour elsewhere. Brentham managed to secure 24 points out of an available 40, with wins over North London and Barclays Bank. Jason Clemow scored his maiden League Hundred for the club against North London with Naz Ali taking his first five wicket haul for the season with figures of 5 for 61 off 18 overs. The game against Barclays saw the inclusion of Keith Dutch in the side whom along with Gary Dattani would form a very controlling and successful first change partnership for the rest of the season.

The 1st team continued to play well and dominate opponents in the early stages of the second half of the season but it was here that the opportunities for promotion were missed. Of our next 4 games, 3 finished as winning draws with the opposition just managing to hang on. As in previous years, we lacked the penetration of a strike bowler needed to finish off the tail enders and secure the win. It was not until the team was outplayed by Ickenham that promotion seemed to have slipped from their grasp (again). So the 1st XI entered the last game of the season with the slimmest of chances of promotion still alive requiring to beat Eastcote and for Ickenham to lose and be deducted points for a slow over rate. Unfortunately it was not to be and as in previous two seasons the First Team narrowly missed out on promotion finishing in fourth position.

Despite not gaining promotion there were positives to come from the season one of which was the addition in the side of Keith Dutch whose contributions with both bat and ball gave the side an added dimension. Also the fact that five players from the second team played for the 1st team at varying stages of the season gaining valuable experience and all of whom were under the age of 22. The Team would admit that there was room for improvement but that 2005 should be their year.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the team for their commitment and support especially Keith Dutch for travelling from Taunton to W5. Also to all the supporters and spectators who backed the team throughout the season and, last but not least, my sincere thanks to Ivor without whom we would struggle.

2nd XI: It could have been a Hollywood script! 18 games and the 2nd XI's fate came down to the final ball of the 2004 League season. The subtle difference was the ball was to be bowled by James Pettifer and not James Belushi. James kept his nerve, the ball was squirted out onto the leg side and the Eastcote batsmen only managed 2 of the 3 runs they needed to secure promotion. It all seemed so unlikely at 100 for 6 before a wonderfully entertaining stand between Buddhi Attanayake and John Magner got us up to a defendable total. All the bowlers stuck to their task and a charged up Brentham XI prevailed.

The season on the whole was a success in that the Team only lost 1 game. We also suffered 3 matches abandoned (without a ball being bowled); more than any other Team in the Division, and which severely reduced our chances of catching Kenton. After our misfortune with the toss of the coin last year, we did at least win more than our fair share of those in 2004. In general the cricket was also enjoyable apart from 2 games against Wycombe House which unfortunately deteriorated into unsavoury affairs and were of no credit to Middlesex League cricket. It was disappointing that we allowed ourselves to be dragged down to a level well below our normal standards in these games.

The batting honours were largely shared around with contributions from all. Special mention to Jon Mays for being the only centurion during the season. Jon passed a hundred on two occasions and his match winning innings against Shepherds Bush was a wonderful achievement on the hottest day of the year. Luke Budden showed glimpses of his undoubted class and with an improvement in his shot selection a position in the top 5 of the first XI will come to him soon. Bowling honours were also shared around. Yogesh Prabhu continued his impressive development and his 7 wicket haul against Wycombe House was appreciated by all except their (drunken?) Bar manager!

Dillip Thakker joined the Club during the season and brought some much needed experience and control with his off spin and his consistent performances. Special mention also to David Hall, who bowled well on occasions including a masterly 6 wicket spell against Barnet.

David would have played more until it became blatantly obvious that Teams wanted the rules strictly adhered to meaning David's pints to overs ratio went well above one! Thanks to all that played this year for their efforts and also to Mike Avery for the match winning champagne that greeted us on our entrance to the bar on many occasions.

3rd XI: The 2004 Season showed a positive response in results compared to 2003, and the Team shape continued to evolve, with the emphasis on the youth being given top priority. We finished in 4th place with 76 points, including 6 wins but also losing 5. As usual the elder players such as Dilip Wilson, John Capps and Harris Lambi put in valuable and match winning performances, but with the future in mind there are deserved mentions for David Hall for his excellent bowling, Nishant Patel for his form with the bat and the emergence of real competition for the wicket keeping berth by two young cricketers, namely Fraser Coxhill and Ashwin Kapoor. Taking into account the resounding victory we had over Harrow in early August (Harrow were duly promoted), the 3rd XI has the ability to mount a genuine promotion push should the availability issues in the Senior sides ever be resolved. It was so pleasing to see in the final weeks of the League Season that Brentham CC was putting out a balanced cricket Team within which the young players were putting in the performances that allowed the team to move to a new level. COLTS:

The UNDER 10: For what was a very young side [including a number of Under 8's and Under 9's] the Team performed well with 5 wins and 6 losses throughout the season. The closest match being the Area Gubby Allen playoff against Ealing which was lost off the last ball of the match. Best performances were put in by Sahil Patel, Joe Brandreth and Chris Hitchcock. Victories in the recently completed Winter League have proved somewhat more elusive.

The **UNDER 11** Team surpassed all expectations and nearly repeated the 'double' success of last year's team. The South Area League was a close affair but in the end, we were edged into 2nd place by Old Actonians [who proved to be our main rivals during the season]. However, in the league play off, we first dispatched Wembley and in the first round proper of the County League Cup, beat Old Actonians to gain some revenge. In the County League Cup quarter final, a much weakened Brentham side lost out to Mill Hill Village who comfortably won the encounter.

Summary of 2004 Season cont'd...

The South Area Cup was won with 10 wicket victories over both Old Actonians and in the Area Final against Chiswick & Latimer. After a Semi Final win by 5 wickets against Harrow St Mary, the County Cup final against Sunbury resulted in a 4 wicket loss, but great credit is due for a battling performance by a very much under strength side.

Other highlights included a resounding victory against Perivale who were bowled out for a total of just four runs and a good all round performance against Turnham Green with 6 batsmen getting into at least the teens. Much of the credit deservedly goes to the Captain, Sam Cato, with aggregate runs of 273 at an average of 46. Good batting support was also provided by Louis Allen, Joe Brandreth, Joseph Pompilis, Oliver Gilford and James Aglionby. Bowling honours were shared between Sam Cato, Sahil Patel, Chris Hitchcock, Jamie Mansi, James Aglionby, Oliver Gilford and Tom Wilkinson.

The UNDER 13 XI's good league campaign, with victories in all but 2 matches gave us the South Area League title. The highlight was the huge total of 200 runs in 20 overs against Perivale. In the County League knockout competition, Mill Hill Village proved a little too strong with Brentham falling 11 runs short, despite a hard hitting 36 not out from Sam Howell. In the South Area League playoff we gained a comfortable win against Ealing by six wickets. Batting was underpinned by Tom Brandreth with an aggregate of 204 runs, with good support from James Hitchcock 139 and Matt Lowen 121. Matthew Lowen proved the most consistent bowler, supported by Toby Blood and Sam Cato as the other main wicket takers. In the recently completed Winter League we achieved 3 wins out of 5 matches. Leading run maker was Chris Clarke with an aggregate of 125, supported by Sam Cato with 98. The best bowling performances were put in by Ravi Patel, Chris Clarke and Sam Cato.

The **UNDER 15** XI had a disappointing 2004. No League wins, though several games were cancelled due to the weather. Our first win was in a friendly, being the 2nd last game of the summer. We were often able to post good scores and there were fine 50s from Tony Pianna and Ashwin Kapoor. Tony was our top scorer and most improved player. However, we could not defend these good scores due to a mixture of poor bowling and fielding. Twice we failed to defend 130+ by allowing the opposition to score at 10 an over in the last 10 overs. A similar bowling problem allowed Ealing to make 166-0 batting first. Hopefully, in 2005 we will see some more enthusiasm for fielding and more concentration with our bowling.

Also we learned that Gary the Groundsman had left. We wish him well in his new career. MAR/APR - The Middx League fined us for non-notification of results to the tune of £175! It's pre-season and many of the general repairs, the refurb programme for the Pavilion etc. were put 'on hold' pending news of the Main Club's Regeneration Programme. We went to the Printers with our 2004 Handbook. Sincere thanks to Darrell West for his blood. sweat and tears in ensuring that we made our deadlines. I'm very grateful. Also Ben Williams the New Zealand Coach turned up and was a great asset in helping Steve and Ken with the Colts. A great shame he had to cut short his stay but we wish him well. But we also notice in April that the Bowling Machine is 'missing'!

MAY/JUNE – We start the relentless task of re-couping unpaid match fees, collecting subs and clothing money etc; very time consuming and depressing always nagging and chasing for money.

JULY/AUG — The topic of 'Over Rates' seem to dominate the Committee Meetings. August was Cricket Week and 2004 was a total wash out. On a more positive note, however, the highlight of my 2004 season was seeing Eric Howard make a visit to W5 to re-acquaint himself with so many old friends. It was a truly glorious day.

SEPT/OCT – No Dinner/Dance organised and no VP's Day this year. We just can't seem to break even on these social events, which is a great shame. The Head Groundsman, Alan Rule, retired this season and we thank him and wish him well with his family.

NOV/DEC – The Christmas Luncheon was well attended but last minute cancellations caused problems again. FINALLY as ever, we are indebted to John Martin our main Sponsor and for the income generated from Handbook Advertisers and Vice Presidents, which we need to retain for all matters cricket. 


