

Summary of 2008 Season

1st XI: Having been promoted into the Premier League in 2007 we were hoping to join Eastcote as only the second team to stay in the league after being promoted. Despite losing some experienced members of the team who helped us to get promotion, we had a young, enthusiastic and tight group of players ready to cause some upsets.

The early signs were positive as we gave some of the established teams a bit of a shock but we were unable to capitalise on our opportunities. In our first game, Stanmore at home, we made 169. This included our highest opening partnership of the season: 39. After a heavy downpour during tea, the pitch was soaking wet even though the covers were on! This led to some outrageous accusations from the Stanmore team of sabotage. When we did start, we made early inroads and took wickets at regular intervals but were unable to force the final couple of wickets. Stanmore finished 111-8 with Naz Ali taking five.

Next we faced Eastcote away and found ourselves precariously placed at lunch on 99-8. However, after lunch we were introduced to Sully Mughal's extraordinary batting technique (it certainly doesn't belong on a cricket pitch). Three sixes later (none of which came out of Eastcote's coaching manual) Sully perished to the first ball he left. Some quick running and steady defence allowed Yogesh Prabhu and Luke Budden to take the score up to 173. Luke was last man out for 75. Again, we forced early wickets and had them 89-5 (including ball of the season for Amit Puri to remove their overseas player). However, we were unable to press home the advantage and Eastcote won by 5 wickets

For the third time in a row we batted first and scored 176 (Hassan Khan 64), this time against Ealing at home. For the third time in a row we picked up wickets consistently from the beginning and had Ealing shaking on 77-4. For the third time in a row we were unable to press home our advantage and allowed Ealing to win by 3 wickets. We felt as though we were creating opportunities to earn ourselves some points (and hopefully victories) but we didn't make the most of these opportunities when they came. This was followed by two comprehensive defeats to Finchley and Brondesbury.

In desperate need of points and a morale boost we travelled to Teddington who were sitting pretty at the top of the table and scoring runs for fun.

A total of 145 never seemed likely to be enough. This total was only made possible by a last wicket stand of 31 between Yogi and 16 year old Tom Brandreth. Taking this momentum into the Teddington innings we struck early and often. Hass was the star of the show, encouraging three of their top four to leave the ball which resulted in them getting bowled (and two of those were one after another!) On a seaming pitch chances came regularly and they were soon 45-7 and 78-9. Some lusty slogging from their number 10 could not stop HK claiming his eighth wicket and leading us to a 25 run VICTORY! The game will live long in the memory as will James Overy receiving a yellow card for his haircut.

Unfortunately we were unable to build on this remarkable result and proceeded to get well beaten in our following seven games. There was one highlight. With the batsmen not quite hitting form it was up to Sully to show them how it was done with his shot-a-ball policy. The hack, slog and slice over mid-wicket (and occasional late cut) were paying dividends and included a typically explosive 71 against Eastcote (at one point Sully and Tom had put on 56 and Sully had...56 of them).

We travelled to Southgate already relegated and our opposition needing points to avoid the drop too. They started well before captain Majid Ali brought himself on to bowl (what he claims is) leg-spin. However, like Ponting to Vaughan in 2005, he immediately got his opposite number and even collected another 4 wickets and ended with 5-65. Chasing 270 in 65 overs we were confident of returning home with something as long as we batted in partnerships and used our overs. Things progressed nicely with Hass making 50 and Maj also cruising past his half century. With 10 overs to go 'skipper' decided to "have a go" and began walking down the pitch at every opportunity and hitting the ball over mid-wicket for 4. The win was still on with two overs left and Maj on 90*. Unfortunately, we didn't quite get the win and Maj just missed his maiden 1st XI ton, finishing on 98*.

In the season's penultimate match we managed to set a Best Partnership of the Season for the league. Chasing in excess of 300 we were 129-9 when Matt Lowen and Naz met in the middle. Again, the lower order showed the batsmen how to do it and both eased their way to 50s and a 100 partnership with glorious drives, Laxman-esque flicks and some not-so-quick singles (Naz was batting). As we know, all good things must come to an end and we lost our final wicket after a partnership of 103. We ended the season losing to Hampstead with Maj finishing the season by scoring 60.

So, a year of some ups and some downs. We have all gained valuable experience by playing against teams who have played at this level for many years. We maintained two things throughout the season: our team spirit (helped by our average age of 23) and our atrocious fielding – Maj counted over 40 dropped catches! Hopefully we can use this season to help us improve and learn from our mistakes. We will, again, have a young side next year but we need to make sure we stay positive and focussed, continue to build and develop our games and support each other during the season.

Finally, a big thank you to Maj and Hass for all their time and effort over the past year. They both spent lots of time providing advice and coaching for the younger members of the team. Both also tried to produce a more professional feel to the team with fielding training and warm ups. It is up to the rest of the team and club members to take it upon themselves to make the most of these opportunities and take responsibility for developing their own game. We wish Maj and Hass all the best wherever they play next year.

2nd XI: At the end of my report on the 2007 season, I expressed my hope that the team that had won promotion would look forward to spending the 2008 season playing a higher standard of cricket. My wishes certainly came true, although with the loss of several senior players from the First team, the higher standard key players found themselves in was the Premier League 1st team side and not the 2's. As a result this meant that, as was the case in our 2 previous seasons in the top division, the team that won promotion looked very different to the one that started the season in the first game against Stanmore. Of the first 4 games, three were against opposition who we should have been looking to take points from and the other was against Ealing who went on to become champions. A lack of pre-season batting practice and time in the middle showed in these games, with the side not making 150 in any innings. 40's from James Bolger (Bolg), James Spackling (Spracks) and Glen Eglington being the only highlights. Mitigating circumstances due to a rain-affected pitch and losing the toss - James Martin (Pikey), not me I hasten to add, for the Acton game could have been claimed, but a lack of partnerships gave the bowlers little to defend. After 4 games the side was rock bottom and pointless.

The game against Southgate saw a much better team performance and a stronger side which looked more like the one from last year. Skip returned and lost the toss (you may notice a recurring theme as the report goes on...) but nevertheless we scored over 220 with Spracks adding another 40 and support from Glen and Inzi, with skip carrying his bat for 89*. Despite promises that there would be no more "pie" in Pikey upon his return, James Martin proved the globalisation of takeaway pizza outlets had truly reached the outer-reaches of the Far East, struggling to reach the crease and hitting the bat with the venom of a Cappo slower ball. Glen replaced him and enjoyed the bounce in the wicket with a hostile spell. However it proved to be the "spin" of James Pettifer (147) that took us close to victory with 4 wickets. Come the last ball any result was possible, but the Southgate No. 11 held out and although we only got 1 point, it was an excellent game of cricket. The next game saw us up against Brondesbury and in my opinion the strongest side we came up against all season. With an excellent bowling attack they limited us to 130 and easily reached their target for the loss of 1 wicket. Our batting form had as much difficulty finding the ground at Teddington as a number of drivers and a makeshift batting order struggled to get a score over 100. 147 again took 4 wickets as we tried to defend the low score, but again it wasn't enough.

Hampstead were in the relegation zone with us at this stage, although a long way ahead and so the game against them was very important in terms of trying to keep in touch with the teams above us. Finally skip managed to win a toss, and with supporters there in number (thank you Claire and PSD crowd) an excellent display of disciplined bowling meant that for the very first time in the top division a team had to use more than 50 overs against us. Another 4 wicket haul from 147 was ably backed up by 2 from Pikey and an excellent spell from Glen which gave nothing away as Hampstead struggled to 200. In reply we spluttered to 80-4 but Mo Ali hit a brilliant 66, with good support from Glen (40*) who saw us through to our first victory of the season with a 6 to win by 4 wickets. This was the start of a good run for us, with games against Richmond in which Spracks hit an excellent 86 and Pikey took 4-67 and Stanmore (skip 65, Inzi 52, with Dilip Thakkar (DT) 4-36 and Glen 3-23) both yielding 4 points. However our performances earlier in the season meant that we really needed victories to give us a chance of staying up and although we had Richmond 9 down and Stanmore 7 we couldn't quite finish them off.

Eastcote were up next, and after the first over we were 14-0. Unfortunately after the second we were 14-2 as Ashwin & Inzi both fell to the pace of Stanley. Skip managed to stay around for 77 and with support from Spracks, Finn Grist on his debut and Glen we got up to 200, but on Eastcote's small ground it didn't look like enough. Although a spirited display in the field and regular wickets kept us in the game, we were probably 20 runs short and Eastcote got home with 3 wickets and overs to spare.

League leaders Ealing were our next opponents. On the hottest day of the year, another lost toss saw us put in again on an excellent batting track. After an early setback, skip and Inzi (38) put on 90. Good partnerships with Glen and Finn and skip reaching 3 figures and carrying his bat (123*) saw us up to 250 from 56. In response 4 wickets apiece from 147 & Glen saw us have Ealing 9 down, but with only a couple of balls at their No. 11 we were again left frustrated as the champions elect survived.

Acton was an interesting game to say the least, with the wicket being particularly lively, our quicker bowlers eyes lit up, but shorter balls with too much width played into the hands of the Acton openers. Instead it was the slower bowling of 147 (6-65) and DT (3-25) that was most effective as we bowled them out for 190. Early wickets again left us in trouble, but Spracks and Ashwin with 20's got us to a reasonable score before they both departed. An injured skip had dropped down the order and guided the side to what everyone on the pitch thought was the 4 point target. Unfortunately as the results were published it transpired that the calculators had not been used correctly and we were actually a couple of runs short - a lesson learned for all concerned.

Next up were Brondesbury, who again confirmed my opinion of them being the strongest team in the league. An excellent 150* from their opener took the game away from us. Despite a 70 from skip we never really looked like getting to their total and were all out with 5 overs to go. The way in which we bounced back from this defeat for the Teddington game gave me great heart. The champions from the previous season turned up thinking we would be easy prey, and left having been beaten by 10 wickets! 4 wickets for Yogi and 2 apiece for Ravi and Pikey dismissed them for a decidedly working-class total of 120. Dr Block (33*) and skip (74*) opened up, saw off the new ball threat and reached the Teddington total without any alarms.

Results meant that going into the game against Hampstead we could still mathematically stay up with 2 wins from our last 2 games.

Results had gone the way that the result was academic in the end. The last game against Richmond was a chance to have some fun after a long season. 147 showed Dr Block he had a rival, making 52 having gone in 2nd ball and being dismissed with the total on 160. Pikey (38) and Spracks (32) pitched in. A cold and wet day, saw Spracks taking a much deserved wicket. I think the less said about the last over of the season the better, suffice it to say that Bolg is unlikely to be taking the new ball in the 2009 season.

In terms of averages James Pettifer topped the bowling with 31 wickets at 18.97, closely followed by Glen Eglington with 12 wickets at 21.75. In his first full season in the 2's Ravi Patel came 3rd with 10 wickets at 29.2. Batting wise skips impressive season with the bat yielded 5 fifties and the unbeaten hundred against champions Ealing, giving an aggregate total of 689 at 86.13. Glen showed his all round ability by again coming second with 236 runs at 33.71. In third place, James Sprackling finished the season with 307 runs at 23.62. Everyone showed in certain matches that they were capable of playing at the top level. Unfortunately there wasn't the sustained level of consistency of those performances that a top division side need to stay up. The nucleus of a young team has however seen what is required and will hopefully work hard at their games to improve to attain and then exceed that level.

My thanks as ever to James Pettifer for his tireless work in ensuring we always had a full side out and for his organisation behind the scenes. To James Bolger for leading the team in the absence of both Captain and Vice-Captain at the start of the season and for his selflessness in always being the early setback when we opened together. To James Martin for his advice on money saving websites (see MartinsMoneyTips for details), captaining while I was away and for his support throughout the season. To Cappo for being a reasonably priced mini-cab on the occasions we needed him and for his umpiring. Finally to all of those who turned out for the 2's throughout what was a difficult season, I would like to thank you all for your effort and your commitment to Brentham. Loyalty to the club is something which has seemingly been on the wane in recent years, but I would like to think the vast majority of you will be at the club for the 2009 season, with the aim of getting up to the next division and driving the club forwards.

3rd XI: It was another new start for the Brentham 3rd XI with a new captain, new division and a much-changed squad, which consisted largely of last year's 4th XI juniors that started the year trying to achieve an instant promotion. It was definitely a mixed campaign that suffered from a lack of stability and consistency, 4 new captains and 4 different home grounds through the season is certainly not a great base for promotion. Top run scorer for the season again was Burly Lad Wilson, who scored an amazing 450 runs for the season, closely followed by Paul "Marcus" Saggers with 425 runs. There were also excellent contributions from Immy and Frazer, who both scored brilliant centuries during the season for us. In the bowling dept, it was Seamus Brett who led the way picking up 24 victims, followed by Rajiv and Joe who contributed consistently with the ball as well as the bat throughout the season. Overall, It was a bright season, where some new stars were born and the future is looking very positive, hopefully next season will bring a promotion charge.

Summary of 2008 Season - Colts

Although only the Under 17 side were in contention of winning their league this year there were still many good performances throughout the summer with many players making real progress. Once again the 4th XI provided opportunities for colts to play a longer version of the game which many of our players took advantage of. Several of the players who started playing adult cricket the previous year also progressed to playing 3rd XI or 2nd XI league cricket on a regular basis. Matthew Lowen and Tom Brandreth also represented the 1st XI regularly.

The Colts Festival saw a morning session for the Under 10 and Under 11 players which was well attended and took the form of a pairs competition. The older boys turned out in numbers in the afternoon but the games were curtailed after persistent rain midway through the second match.

The Colts week was fairly successful, however, we were let down by the opposition and the weather at times. The Under 10 and 11 boys who attended had coaching sessions. On the Friday the inter-club game was particularly successful with large numbers of boys enjoying a good game and this was followed up by an evening of food provided by parents and an impromptu game of footy.

The presentation evening saw Hallam Moseley present the player of the season trophies and gave everyone an opportunity to get together before winter set in.

One cause of concern is the lack of numbers of players at Under 10 and below. Where previously numbers have been healthy ensuring a broad base from which to select sides, we now find ourselves struggling to field teams. An urgent influx of primary school pupils is needed.

Elsewhere numbers and quality is good. With 13, 15 and 17s having little trouble in fielding sides and indeed the U13 running a number of B team matches we look forward to a successful 2009.

Altogether the colts set up provided 24 players for the senior teams this year.

<u>U17's</u>: One of the most pleasing aspects of this group of players is that they have a good team spirit and clearly enjoy playing together. This is demonstrated by their regular availability meaning that on several occasions we did not need to get younger players to make up the side even though there were exam commitments for all.

Impressive performances against Perivale, Old Actonians, Wembley and Acton showed what the side was capable of with Matt Lowen (player of the Year) bowling beautifully all-season and captaining the side with great maturity. Finn Grist in his first season with us settled in well and batted consistently well while all the other players made valuable contributions at times.

Of the 13 most regular players all also played significant amounts of adult league cricket at various levels which augurs well for the future. There are also some useful U15 players who will be joining this team in 2009.

U17s Player of the Year - Matt Lowen PETER BRANDRETH

<u>U15's</u>: The 2008 season was one of unfulfilled potential and occasional frustration, with our final league position of 4th, not being particularly representative of the team's ability. If it wasn't for close matches, controversial (non-Brentham) umpiring decisions, and three abandoned games, things may have been very different.

Our two league wins were comprehensive 10 wicket victories against Old Actonians and Perivale. Strong bowling restricted the sides to totals of 106-4 (Jamie Mansi 3/17) and 55 all out (Sahil Patel 3/10) respectively; these were competently chased by our openers (Rishi Majithia 54*, Sam Cato 46*) (Louis Allen 30*, Faisal Ahmed 16*). Close encounters against eventual league winners Ealing, were, as always, somewhat heated. In a cup match where one of our players was given out LBW without an Ealing appeal, we scored a 'gutsy' 78 on a dodgy track. Ealing only managed to clinch victory in the final over. The home league fixture saw Ealing post 151-1. HON, SECRETARY'S REPORT 2008 SEASON

The Cricket Section's Centenary Year was finally here. The preparations were put in hand long ago at a time when Brian Reid, Bharat Patel and David Vincent were on the Committee. Various personnel started researching our Club's history, Ivor checked statistics and David Bloomfield researched archives and communicated with "old boys" to rekindle memories. Very many people worked behind the scenes, too many to mention by name, but thanks go to all involved in the preparation and culmination of the centenary.

On a personal note, I should like to thank all those who were kind enough to help throughout the year. No names mentioned, otherwise this Report would double in size!

JANUARY Winter Nets took place at St. Benedict's.

Cup Competitions - the entry forms were submitted, fees paid and the draws were awaited.

Clubmark became an issue that needed to be addressed. James Martin took over the reins of this whole scheme and "ran with it".

In preparation for the AGM, the Annual Accounts were prepared by Guy de Jonk. Guy was put under extreme time pressure due to the lack of a Treasurer but he "came up trumps" and produced them in 48 hrs. Following the AGM, 4 new Vice Presidents were honoured. They were Nick Lambi, Michael James, Colin Philips and Jason Clemow.

FEBRUARY

The Centenary Dinner was held this month. Centenary ties were designed, sourced and available for purchase on the night. A Centenary Brochure was placed on the table at the Dinner and a written report of the evening was sent down to Darrell West in Bournemouth for inclusion in the 2008 Handbook.

MARCH / APRIL / MAY

Wilf Slack, the 3rd XI Ground, had still not requested an invoice for payment and they had not replied to any correspondence. It was learnt on the 29 March that the ground was not available. Two home dates at Durston House, then 2 more at the Civil Service Ground in Chiswick and at Warren Farm were secured. However (admin) chaos resulted (later in the season) and there was a fixture oversight. A game thought to be covered by Civil Service, Chiswick was not and a team of youngsters turned up for a game of cricket but no pitch was available. It is not an ideal situation for the 3rd XI to have a roaming home ground. It caused confusion not only with the players but also with the opposition added to which there was a logistical nightmare for the teas. This situation needs to be addressed for the future.

Following the pre-season March Committee Meeting it became clear that there was likely to be a cash flow problem from day one with regard to 1st XI lunches & teas. It was imperative that these were sponsored. As it turned out 13 of the 18 games were covered.

The Main Club asked for a short-term loan of £5,000, returnable when the annual subscriptions started to be paid. It had a cash-flow issue with its refurbishment. This was repaid to the Cricket Section on 1st May. (Other Sections were also asked to give short term loans)

Middx. Association of Cricket Groundsman Annual Subscriptions were paid. This season should see some results in the square from the deep drilling in the previous autumn.

Mark Saggers received confirmation that our 4th XI will be playing at Harrow CC.

Aluminium Patio Furniture was ordered and paid at a cost of just under £600.

New Cricket Covers were required as a result of storm damage and purchased at a cost of £5,100 (+ VAT). The old white canvas covers were re-cycled and used as a "ball catcher" along the bottom of the boundary fence to the allotments. However, within one evening of being put up these were found to be covered by graffiti. James Pettifer and John Capps spent a Sunday morning cleaning the paint off.

The new Patio Area was constructed and completed at a cost of £4,300. This only left the garden to be planted up.

A total of 12-15 fridges were cleared from around the grounds as the Main Club had been using the cricket area as a dumping ground whilst its refurbishment was taking place. It was necessary for these to be cleared failing which Clubmark Approval would not have been obtained (health & safety issues for our Colts and members might also have arisen).

JUNE / JULY / AUGUST

The annual problem of cricketers not paying their subscriptions to the Main Club on time recurred. However, this season it was dealt with, successfully, by Mark Saggers.

The new Flag was hoisted in readiness for the forthcoming CCC & MCC games in August. A Banner and Centenary Benches also came on stream.

The 2008 Isle of Wight Tour had to be cancelled as there were more supporters than actual players!

£1,700 was received from the Insurance Company for the storm damage to the cricket covers.

On Saturday 26 July, the 1st XI were playing away to Ealing and John Poore invited the Brentham VPs to lunch @ Ealing CC. Lunch contributions were then split between the respective Colts' organisations. It was a good enjoyable way to raise funds. During the day it was arranged that a shopping spree in Poores of Acton's Garden Centre would produce plants for the new Patio Garden.

The usual "cricket week" fixture was re-arranged to fall in the week of the CCC and MCC games. On the Tuesday Chris Healey's usual game and, on the Thursday, Charlie/James Pettifer's game, took place. The CCC game on the Wednesday saw lunches & teas opened up to spectators. After the league game on the Saturday, the Pavilion was prepared for the MCC game. A Sunday Carvery Lunch was organised in the Hall Bar. A great day with so many faces, so many friends and so many ex-players and supporters together with the added bonus was Brentham CC's win on the field.

SEPTEMBER marked the end of the season

The Colts Presentation took place at the beginning of October and was a lovely family evening.

This period involved the usual chasing of debtors and of end of season reports.

James Martin had an "out of season" meeting with the personnel behind Clubmark and completion is at hand.
